



## Request to Decline Federal PELL Grant Funds

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2012 reduced the maximum timeframe (Lifetime Eligibility) during which a student is eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant to a maximum of six (6) years (12 semesters/18 quarters) or 600% toward an undergraduate degree. The U.S. Department of Education will track each student's Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU) among all institutions.

If you wish to decline all or reduce a portion of Pell Grant funds to preserve eligibility for future enrollment periods you must submit this completed form to the Office of Financial Aid. You may decline the Pell Grant funds for one or more semesters within the current award year.
